19<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> June, 2024, Harbin, China

### Bulletin 1

With the endorsement of Asian University Sports Federation (AUSF), the 2024 Asian University Wushu Championship, to be held from 19<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> June in Harbin, China, will be organized by the Federation of University Sports of China and the Heilongjiang Provincial Sports Bureau of China, and supported by the Wushu Federation of Asia.

## 2.Competition Events

The championship includes 3 categories of competition: Taolu, Sanda and Long/Short Weapon.

### 2.1.Taolu

#### 2.1.3. Taiji Events

- 42-style Taiji barehanded routine
- Chen, Yang, Wu (吴), Wu (武) and Sun style of barehanded routine
- 42-style Taiji weapon routine: sword and other Taiji weapons routine

#### 2.1.4. Duilian Events(Choreographed Sparring)

- bare hand vs. bare hand
- weapon vs. Weapon
- bare hand vs. weapon

#### Note:

- Each competitor is only allowed to compete in one from the Optional event, Traditional event and Taiji event; Within the same event, one can compete in one bare hand and one weapon routine, except Duilian event;

- For the Fourth group bare hand routine in the Traditional Taolu event, competitors can also choose any one from the 129 kinds of traditional barehanded

routines for competition, other than the 13 frequently practiced ones listed in 2.1.2.

- Each country or region can enter a maximum of 3 men and 3 women in the Optional events; a maximum of 5 men and 5 women in the Traditional events; a group of men (2-3) and a group of women (2-3) in the Duilian events.

## 3.Competition rules:

The competition of the 2024 Asian University Wushu Championship will be conducted in accordance with the current rules of the International Wushu Federation (IWUF).

In case of any inconsistency or dispute, the English version shall prevail. Any unexpected circumstances not covered by the Regulations and Rules shall be solved in the following ways:

---General problems shall be solved according to the constitution and rules of the Asian University Sports Federation (AUSF).

---Technical problems shall be solved in accordance with IWUF rules and regulations.

#### **4. Awards**

##### **4.1. Taolu**

1<sup>st</sup> place: Gold medal and Certificate

2<sup>nd</sup> place: Silver medal and Certificate

3<sup>rd</sup> place: Bronze medal and Certificate

4<sup>th</sup> -8<sup>th</sup> place: Certificate

##### **4.2. Sanda & Long/Short Weapon**

1<sup>st</sup> place: Gold medal and Certificate

2<sup>nd</sup> place: Silver medal and Certificate

3<sup>rd</sup> place (juxtaposition): Bronze medal and Certificate

4<sup>th</sup> -8<sup>th</sup> place: Certificate

If the entries were less than or equal to 8 in one event, then the number of certificates awarded will be adjusted according to the principle of minus one from the actual entries.

#### **5. Participation**

##### **5.1. Eligibility**

Only competitors who meet the following conditions may participate in this Championship:

5.1.1. be full-time students who are currently officially registered as proceeding towards a degree or diploma at the university or similar institute whose status is recognized by the appropriate national academic authority of their country or regions;

5.1.2. be former students who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the preceding year (i.e. 2023);

5.1.3. be at least 17 and less than 28 years of age on January 1st in the year of the event, that is, competitors should be born between January 1, 1996 and December 31, 2006; must hold a valid passport of the country or region he/she represents.

5.2. Each country and region is authorized enter to one (1) team to participate in the championship, which comprises the following 3 categories, namely, Taolu, Sanda and Long/Short Weapon.

5.3. Each country or region can register a maximum of fifteen (15) officials and a maximum of fifty (50) competitors. The maximum entry of competitors in each category from each country and region is listed below.

## 7. Finances and Insurance

7.1. The participation fee is **USD60** per person per day. As mentioned in Section 5.3, extra participants with more than sixty-five (65) people will pay **USD120** per person per day as the participation fee.

7.2. The registration fee for AUSF is **USD10** per person (**USD20** per person for non-AUSF members), which will be collected by AUSF Secretariat in cash on registration.

7.3. The delegation need to pay **USD120** per person per day for the extra stay (before or after the event).

7.4. The OC will provide first-aid service. The delegation must buy insurance for its members. Insurance at least covers civil liability, material losses, injuries and medical expenses. Any expenses arising from hospital visits and treatment should be paid by the insurance of competitors and officials.

## 8. Travel

The official points of arrival&departure are Harbin Taiping International Airport (HRB), Harbin Railway Station and Harbin West Railway Station.

8.1. The trip to and from the official points of arrival&departure should be arranged and funded by the participating teams.

8.2. Transportation between the official points of arrival & departure and the accommodation place, as well as all other transport related to official program will be arranged by the Organizing Committee.

## 9. Visa Information

9.1. Except for visa-free persons as specified, foreigners who participate in this Championship shall apply for Chinese visa from the embassy or consulates of China in their countries, or any other institute authorized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs

of the People's Republic of China.

9.2. The delegation that need to apply for visa must provide requested personal information and passport copies and submit to OC before **10 May at the latest**, after receiving the relevant information, OC will issue the invitation letters as soon as possible. AUSF is committed to dope free sport, and strictly follows the enclosed guidelines and procedures of WADA approved Anti-Doping guidelines and procedures for the safety of our athletes and fairness of play for our sport.
